


MAP: (1. Indicate NORTH in circle. 2. Represent each structure as an open box. 3. Number each structure inside of its box.)



BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION:

Beginning at point A, the northwest corner of the Foell property, and proceeding east southeast in a line encompassing the rear boundaries of the house lots on the north side of Route 15 to point B, the northwest corner of the Guyette property (#35). Continuing north to point C, northwest corner of the Weston property (#34), and then east to point D, northeast corner of the lot upon which the Denno house is located. The boundary line proceeds south along the rear boundaries of the structures located on the east side of Tower Road and curves to encompass the rear property lines of the buildings on Route 128 to point E, northeast corner of the Kennison property. The line continues southerly along the rear boundaries of the White School, Mackey, and Hennigan lots to point F, southeast corner of the Hennigan property. From point F the boundary continues west northwest along the rear property lines of the Essex Free Library and the Bentley house to point G, the southwest corner of the Bentley property. From G

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

The architecture of Essex Center is a sampling which spans the establishment of the Center to the present. Around 1822 Essex Center began to supercede the original settlements at Page's Corner and Butler's Corner. It was at the center that the churches of the town established themselves. The range of periods of building are reflected by various architectural styles such as Greek Revival, Gothic Cottage, and Italianate. Rather than being noted for examples of high-style architecture, however, Essex Center illustrates vernacular building types of rural Vermont.

The line proceeds north to point A where the boundary began. The boundary thus described includes all structures within its borders designated by numbers 1 through 35 and represented in the above map.

This clapboard-sided structure is in the Italianate style. The gable-front main block has a round louvered attic vent. Both the side (east) ell and block have paired brackets supporting the cornice and peaked door and window heads. The entry door is sheltered by a flat hood supported by curved sawn brackets.

The painted brick main block is 3 x 1 bays and includes corner pilasters, segmentally-arched window lintels above pointed arched wooden heads, and an east bay window. A clapboard ell extends to the rear which has an attached board and batten addition. The detailing of the structure is largely Gothic, probably added after construction. The pilasters may have been a subsequent addition, probably preceding the "gothicization" of the house.

This Gothic Cottage is sheathed in clapboards. The main block is three bays across with a central gable wall dormer. The single bay entry porch is decorated with vergeboards of a fleur-de-lis motif. The side ell also includes a central wall dormer. Its porch is supported by incised piers. Both sections of the structure have paired brackets supporting the cornice and vergeboards decorating peaked window heads.

 This structure was constructed c. 1819 and its first tenant was Thaddeus Fletcher who was just commencing the mercantile business with \$ 400 of borrowed money. He later moved to larger quarters and to Burlington, but remained an active supporter of Essex churches and town concerns. The structure has been added to many times over the years and is sided primarily in shiplap and clapboards.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

The Old Classical Institute boarding house, the town's only example of French Second Empire, is the last remnant of the Essex Classical Institute, once located on the site of the present town school buildings. The Institute, first opened in 1855, experienced many changes in management and name during the years it made higher education available to residents of Chittenden County. The boarding house was constructed during a period of prosperity when enrollments were up and additional facilities were required to accommodate teachers and students.
